"III Inno Cyber Law Week Tashkent 2025" on the results of the international conference

REPORT

The conference, organized by the Department of Cyber Law of TSUL with the support of the Ministry of Justice, brought together leading experts from 15 countries, including Japan, Italy, Poland, Turkey, Germany, and India. The main achievements of the conference are: signing a memorandum of cooperation with the University of Münster (Germany), developing expert recommendations for bringing Uzbekistan's legislation into line with international standards in the field of digital law, and forming a concept for establishing a Center for Best Practices in the field of cyber law. Detailed information about the composition of the participants, the program, and international partners is provided in Appendix 1 "General Analytical Report of the Conference."

Based on the results of expert discussions, priority recommendations for the legal system of Uzbekistan are systematized in five main areas, including regulation of artificial intelligence, data protection, digital finance, transformation of public administration, and digital legal education. In particular, experts recommend developing a law "On the Regulation of Artificial Intelligence," bringing the law "On Personal Data" into line with international standards, and creating a regulatory framework for testing digital financial instruments. The full texts of 34 expert recommendations, along with the justification of their relevance and expected results, are presented in Appendix 2 in the "Compendium of Lecture Results."

For the effective implementation of the developed recommendations, the Cyber Law Department has prepared a preliminary roadmap for 2025-2026, indicating responsible executors and specific deadlines. According to expert assessments, the consistent implementation of the proposed measures can have a positive impact on the development of Uzbekistan's digital economy, increase the country's investment attractiveness, and strengthen its position in international rankings for digital development. I request that you consider the possibility of creating an interdepartmental working group to coordinate the implementation of the most relevant recommendations.
